



## Major Components of Total Federal Outlays, FY 1965–2015




## Medicaid's Share of State Budgets Including and Excluding Federal Funds, SFYs 1987–2014




## **Components of Spending Growth**

- Number of enrollees
  - Eligibility expansion
  - Economic downturns
  - Population aging
- Spending per enrollee
  - Enrollment mix
  - Volume and mix of services used
  - Prices paid for items and services



### Components of Spending Growth in Real Medicaid Benefit Spending 1975–2010




Majority of historical growth in real (inflation-adjusted)


## Annual Growth Rates in Medicaid Enrollment and Spending, FY 1975–2014


### Components of Growth in Real Medicaid Benefit Spending by Eligibility Group, FY 1975–2010

## Prices

- States have flexibility to set provider payment rates
- May not track with underlying growth in health care prices
- May be influenced by mechanisms for financing the state share

# Spending Growth in 2014 and Beyond

- Medicaid spending increased 8 percent from FY 2013 (\$460 billion) to FY 2014 (\$498 billion)
  - Federal spending increased 13 percent
  - State spending increased 1 percent
- Largely driven by the eligibility expansion, but primary care payment bump and high-cost drugs also contribute to spending growth
- Spending growth rates projected for 2015 and beyond are lower, reflecting moderation of expansion effects, expiration of primary care payment bump, and an increase in drug rebates


